2021 NOMINATIONS FOR Φ Δ Θ CANADIAN FOUNDATION AWARDS

It is time to consider which of your chapter / emerging chapter members / campus leaders best merits recognition for demonstrated excellence in leadership, scholarship, chapter/campus participation and community service through an award from The Canadian Phi Delta Theta Scholarship Foundation (the "Canadian Foundation").

The nomination and application process is described below. Successful applicants are those who adhere closely to Foundation's deadlines and instructions.

Process and Deadlines	
Step:	Deadline:
1. Chapter President / Scholarship Chair announces that Canadian Foundation awards are now open and sends this Notice to every chapter member	Before Christmas
2. Chapter designates award nominee(s) based on criteria in this notice	1 st chapter meeting in 2022
3. Chapter submits nomination form (attached to this notice)	Saturday, January 15, 2022
4. Each award nominee submits a complete award application via <i>MyPhidelt</i>	Saturday, January 29, 2022

While there are likely several outstanding candidates, the Phi Delta Theta Canadian Foundation will accept **a maximum of two nominations and applications per chapter**: one in the *Academic Pathway* and one in the *Leadership Pathway*.

Please review this complete notice so that you can answer questions and help identify worthy candidates. Please share this notice with your members right away so that they can consider being nominated.

We look forward to receiving your chapter's nomination(s) according to the dates outlined above. Please note that these deadlines are firm and extensions are not possible.

Section A: What is the Phi Delta Theta Canadian Foundation? (Please send this notice to every chapter member so they can review and consider placing their name in nomination for an award.)

The Canadian Foundation was founded in 1974 to recognize outstanding scholars and emerging leaders at Canadian campuses where Phi Delta Theta has a chapter. Hundreds of Canadian fraternity alumni, undergraduates and friends have donated to the Foundation, and we have awarded more than 315 awards totaling over \$360,000 to undergraduates from every chapter / emerging chapter where Phi Delta Theta has a chapter in Canada. In recent years the Foundation has awarded grants to individuals ranging from \$500 up to \$4,000.

The Canadian Foundation is especially proud to recognize the many undergraduates and chapters who have supported the Foundation through their participation in the Iron Phi program (half of all proceeds raised via Iron Phi in Canada go to the Canadian Foundation). Section B: What are the Leadership and Academic Pathways?

Every Canadian chapter and emerging chapter can nominate one individual for each Pathway:

The **Academic Pathway** (established in 1974) recognizes those undergraduates who have a well-rounded commitment to chapter, campus and community involvement as well as a strong emphasis on academic achievement. Financial need is also considered.

The **Leadership Pathway** (established in 2016) recognizes those undergraduates who demonstrate their leadership abilities and achievements in the chapter, on campus and in the community. Financial need is also considered. While academic proficiency is considered, scholastic excellence is not emphasized to the same degree as in the Academic Pathway.

The top award winner from across Canada each year is recognized as the *J. Fred Green Award* winner.

Section C: Who Is eligible to be a chapter's / emerging chapter's nominee?

Every Canadian chapter / emerging chapter can submit the name(s) of, at most, two nominees who meet the following requirements (one for the Leadership Pathway and one for the Academic Pathway):

1. A nominee must be a **full-time undergraduate student** currently enrolled in a Canadian university at which Phi Delta Theta has a chapter / emerging chapter
2. A nominee must, at the time of application, have successfully completed at least one academic term, and have at least one more term of full-time studies to complete before receiving a university recognized undergraduate degree. An individual graduating in 2022 is eligible to apply for an award.
3. A chapter / emerging chapter may nominate a member, Phikeia, or a non-Phi that meets the nomination criteria
4. At most, for each chapter, one of these nominees may be nominated for consideration in the *Leadership Pathway*, and one for consideration in the *Academic Pathway*
5. Chapters must select their nominee(s) by no later than the deadline noted on page 1
6. The Chapter President or Scholarship Chair shall submit the completed Nomination Form (attached) by no later than the deadline noted on page 1
7. Once nominated, the individual(s) apply for a Canadian Foundation award via *MyPhidelt*. **Nominees must be registered on MyPhidelt in order to apply for an award at <https://portal.phideltatheta.org>**

Section D: What must each complete awards application submission contain?

Each application submission must include the following:

1. The official application submission, as completed on *MyPhidelt*
2. A current university transcript (submitted via *MyPhidelt*)
3. A photo of the nominee suitable for publication and presentation during the Canadian Foundation's national awards broadcast announcing the winners in the spring (submitted via *MyPhidelt*)

Section E: Important final considerations:

1. Please be thorough and respect the submission deadlines noted on page 1 of this document.
 - Submission of the chapter's nomination form is the responsibility of the Chapter President
 - Submission of each applicant's completed award submission via *MyPhidelt* is each applicant's responsibility
2. **All application submissions must be complete and submitted by the deadline noted on page 1.**

There will be no exceptions to this deadline as the Canadian Foundation's Board will meet soon thereafter to review applications. The Board reserves the right to assign an applicant to another Pathway at the Board's discretion.
